The 2023-24 Boxwood Garden Club year began with the June 8, 2024 Board meeting and the following members:

President Kay Tyler filled the 18 operational committees (72 member positions) that make up the club. Most committee members serve a two-year commitment. Phone calls were made to members to gauge interests and strengths, which proved to be a time-consuming but invaluable to getting this part of the job done. A tool for the president to use to determine and know member strengths, interests in the various functions of the club would be invaluable. A simple survey is recommended for future presidents' use and should be collected annually for changes in membership needs and interests.

Membership meeting dates were established per bylaws to be the 4th Tuesday of each month, except when there is a conflict, such as November (Thanksgiving), January (4 Club meeting), and May (Memorial Day). No meetings were held in December (Christmas) and April (Historic Garden Week).

Board meetings were assigned to the Tuesday prior to the membership meeting, unless otherwise noted. The membership and board meeting minutes can be found in the Green Book, google drive and Boxwood website, www.boxwoodgc.org.

Katherine Adamson, 1st VP, planned the 2023-24 programs, speakers, and venues with great suggestions from members and made all the arrangements with venues, speakers, and hostesses. She implemented a sign-up genius for hostesses for each meeting, the spring cocktail party, and the annual meeting and luncheon.

The programs were successful on all levels – a variety of relevant, interesting topics, engaging speakers, and new and familiar places to meet. There was considerable confusion about hostess costs, duties especially as it applies to the annual meeting and cocktail party. It was decided that the hostess information sheet could be better communicated with a separate document. It was determined a working document will be created and shared with hostesses/membership.

Stuart Roberts, 2nd VP was heroic with her dedication to revising the Green Book format and layout. The result was a concise, organized yearbook for easier use for future use. Due to the number of Green Books in stock, the size of the book remained the same. Minor changes and updates will be incorporated into the next Green Book based on membership feedback. The printing cost was reduced by half from the previous year.

Kate Whitehead, Recording Secretary, was the keeper of all membership related information located in Google contacts and documents. Her experience as a graphics and advertising professional has been invaluable. She has been well-suited for this role with her expertise in Google forms, design, communication, and calm spirit and demeanor.

Kate has gone beyond her recording secretary duties to support merchandising efforts. The board discussed several products to be evaluated such as Tervis tumblers, aprons, note pads, and garden totes. BGC note pads and note cards and Bee City note cards (artwork by Anna Aquino and used with her permission) were printed and sold to members and at fundraising events. The time and energy to create and plan for these should/could become a Merchandising and Marketing committee with a self-sustaining budget and/or part of the fundraising committee.

Cammy Carleton, treasurer, initiated the budget for the 2023-24 fiscal year based on past income/expenses and estimated income and costs. The budget was presented and approved by the Board in August and the membership in September. Collecting dues has been a big part of this job and the ability to pay online has been helpful. Suggestions to use Venmo or other apps to collect funds has been suggested. BGC has a square account and can take credit card payments for events. Cammy has kept accurate and timely records and reported the financial health of the club.

During this year, the Board approved moving \$50,000 of excess funds from a 0 interest checking account to a higher yielding money market investment account

with Davenport Investments, where the Endowment Fund is managed. These additional funds are to be used for future anticipated expenses including the 2031 GCV Annual Meeting which Boxwood will be responsible for. The GCV President, Debbie Lewis, sent a letter in February with information about organizing the Annual Meeting. Because the Endowment Funds are limited to use for charitable contributions, the Board requested \$2,100 from the Endowment Fund to support the charitable contributions that support Boxwood's mission. Kit Sullivan, Corresponding Secretary, has been very timely with writing notes to members and their families, as needed. As past president, Kit's presence and insight has been invaluable.

The first GCV event in our 'Boxwood year' was the Lily Show, held June 8, in quaint Orange, VA. The creative team of **Missy Goode and Natalee Johnsrud** secured the **Blue Ribbon for Artistic Interclub** for Boxwood GC with a Federal style arrangement. **Sarah Crane** won ribbons in Horticulture and **Kay Tyler** entered several stems and assisted transporting the artistic entry with Missy Goode. **Cathy Lee**, GCV Artistic Chair was a key planner of the event and **Missy Buckingham** worked the show.

During the year, there were a several workdays at Peter Paul Development, organized by **Anna Aquino** with **Suzy Heberle**. **Laura Strickler**, social media chair, posted photos of our members who helped with the cleanup: **Nella Timmons, Susan Overton, Judy Kidd, Janice Whitehead, Lisa Caperton, Kay Tyler, Lisa Tripodi, and Amy Wilson**. The garden is a wonderful oasis of green space and is growing beautifully!

Sadly, one of the first member news to share was the death of **Mary Glen Taylor**, on June 16, 2023. Her work in the field of conservation and preservation didn't go unnoticed. An article of her work was published in the Richmond Times-Dispatch and many donors gave funds to Boxwood Garden Club to 'Remember Me and Plant a Tree.' This was often quoted by Mary Glen and funds collected were designated for that purpose. **Mercer Taylor**, one of our Boxwood Garden Club members, and Mary Glen's daughter, gave the Club some lovely fairy houses that her mother created along with many garden-related items that will be sold to make sure more trees will be planted in the future.

The September 26 Business Meeting at St. Mary's was well attended. Members were asked to donate native plants for the Peter Paul Playground and received horticulture credit. **The Exhibiting Chairs** were all new this year: **Jenny Andrews for Horticulture, Lisa Caperton for Artistic and Gina Denniston for Photography.** Gina also serves on the GCV Photography committee. This year, the artistic workshops were pre-scheduled the day prior to an exhibiting meeting and listed in the Green Book. Great exhibits and participation! Several garden related items were raffled at the meeting. The Green Books were distributed to those present and delivered or mailed to those who could not attend. Minutes for meetings are on the Boxwood website.

On October 6-8, 2024, history was made with **HISTORY BLOOMS**, the new GCV Flower Show held at The Virginia Museum of History and Culture. **Cathy Lee** was the creative force behind the event as GCV Artistic Chair. That success has led to the 2nd History Blooms scheduled for February 28- March 2, 2025 at VMHC and **Cathy Lee** will be the Chair of this clever event. Participants throughout the state interpreted their choice of Virginia parks, historic restoration sites or regions for this non-judged event. The Boxwood GC entry was inspired by Wilton House, one of the GCV restoration sites. **Natalee Johnsrud** created a beautiful Georgian arrangement. **Sarah Crane, Missy Buckingham, Janice Whitehead, Kate Whitehead** among others decorate the event.

October 17-18, was the Board of Governor's meeting, held at Cape Charles, VA and hosted by the Garden Club of the Eastern Shore. Boxwood members attending were **Cathy Lee (GCV Artistic Chair), Kathryn Angus (District at Large, District 1), Missy Buckingham, Past President of the GCV, and President, Kay Tyler.** There were many activities and dinners to create new acquaintances and build relations with other clubs in the state. The historic sites and places of interest along the shore were inspiring. At the closing dinner, the **Four Richmond GCV clubs were presented The Common Wealth Award for The Virginia War Memorial Public Green Space** by GCV President Debbie Lewis.

The October 24 membership meeting was held at the Round House at Byrd Park, a new venue for our club. **Anna Aquino** has worked extensively with Chris Frelke, the speaker and Director of Richmond Parks, Recreation and Community Facilities, who recommended this special meeting place. His talk - Richmond's Monumental Movement in Parks wowed us with the growth and community

partners that are being made through this department. There were many exhibits in all categories.

The Science Museum of Virginia (SMV) was the site for the November 14 meeting. Tyler Holtzman, SMV's Resident Horticulturist, presented the completed Green Space Phase I plans and introduced the 2nd and final phases to come. They announced that there are volunteer opportunities to help maintain the Green Space. The important portion of the business meeting was voting the five (5) new members into Boxwood GC. The Membership Committee, led by **Kim Condyles** presented the sponsored new members and votes were cast. The new Boxwood members voted in were **Nicole Bridge, Brooke Lustig, Julie Sprinkle, Amy Thalhimer, and Emily Tripp.**

A memorial to **Mary Glen Taylor** was held at Bandy Field, one of several of her special projects that exists today because of her efforts, which has grown into its own recognized and supported organization. A tree was planted in her memory on the property in November.

On November 28, The **annual Greens Workshop** was held at **Laura Strickler's garage** and driveway and proved to be a wonderful location for collecting very cool pinecones for the holidays in addition to getting those holiday wreaths and centerpieces put together. Those who brought greens to share received horticulture credit. This was the first opportunity for new members to be included in the Boxwood activities and it was nice to see and meet several of them.

Kit Sullivan planned and purchased materials to create arrangements to give to our **Life Members. Judy Kidd** delivered most of the arrangements. Many notes of thanks were received for these small tokens of appreciation from our esteemed Life members. This has become a nice tradition for our club members.

December 5th was the annual Shopping Spree and fundraiser at The Shops at 5807 and was well-attended. Boxwood GC received a 10% donation of the proceeds at the private event. **Joan Sewell** organized the event and put together a raffle to bring in extra funds. Several fundraising committee members also helped with the setup, providing appetizers and wine, including **Jennifer Hudgins, Muffy Jamieson, Cathy Lee, Laura Trevey**, board members **Cammy Carleton, Kate Whitehead** along with Joan's sister. It was great to meet several new members at the event, too.

The New Member Orientation meeting was held at the Kent Valentine House on January 10th and all five new members were present with their sponsor(s), Boxwood Board members and specific Boxwood committee chairs. The new members attending were **Nicole Bridge, Brooke Lustig, Julie Sprinkle, Amy Thalheimer, and Emily Tripp.** Molly Carey was instrumental with her expertise as past Membership Chair. **Kim Condyles**, chair of the Membership Committee, led the meeting along with President, **Kay Tyler**. The membership committee members attending were **Bobbie Flatin, Missy Gullquist, and Nella Timmons.**

The GCV promotional video was shown and was a good reminder of the impact GCV has had on the state for conservation and preservation efforts over the last 100 years. President Debbie Lewis was working at KVH and stopped in to say hello and display the new GCV merchandise. Information was shared about the GCV and Boxwood histories, membership expectations including being an active part of Historic Garden Week and first year duties. Green Books and GCV/Boxwood gift bags were given to the new members.

January 17th was the Richmond GCV 4-Club meeting held at Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden (held every other year). Tuckahoe Garden Club organized and managed this meeting with the other three GCV Richmond clubs contributing to the speaker fees and hostess costs. The guest speaker was Brie Arthur, horticulturist from North Carolina and author of ***The Foodscape Revolution***. Her energetic talk about combining vegetables with ornamentals in flower beds, using natives throughout the garden and landscape and educating the youth in her community and neighbors in her HOA was inspiring. The fundraising committee created notecards advertising the March 1 Art & Flower Show and distributed these at each chair at the meeting.

The February 27th meeting was held at All Saints Episcopal Church with Mary Spotswood Underwood, who created a festive tablescape with a large floral centerpiece. Six of the fairy houses from Mary Glen were auctioned and found new homes with the highest bidders. **Ann Reed and Jan Tutton** were recognized for celebrating their 90th birthdays at the meeting. The largest fairy garden was donated to the Westminster Canterbury Children's Center at the suggestion of resident Susan Armstrong and Boxwood Life member. A wonderful home for an amazing fairy garden!

The Boxwood Garden Club Art & Flower Show held March 1, 2024 was the culmination of great ideas, cohesive planning, and energetic members of the

fundraising committee. The committee members that led the way were **Camille Robinson, Laura Trevey, Muffy Jamieson, Jennifer Hudgins, Joan Sewell, and Kate Whitehead** with extra help from **Natalee Johnsrud** and **Cathy Lee** and their flower show expertise.

A very special thank you to the new members who made the lovely flower arrangements, the members who supplied the flowers, and the talented designers **Lisa Caperton** and **Sarah Crane**.

The Boxwood meeting year came to a finale at the Annual Meeting and Lunch held on Tuesday May 14, at **Lucy Rise’s** beautiful home. There was a strong turnout - 65 members registered. 2023-24 Boxwood Garden Club Committee Highlights

Conservation Committee

The Conservation Forum was held on November 3 in Charlottesville, VA and attended by **Lee Nelson**, Conservation chair, **Marty Parrish**, conservation committee member, **Anna Aquino**, who presented at the forum, and **Helen Nunley**, member of the GCV Conservation Committee.

In January, **Lee Nelson** and **Anna Aquino**, along with several others from Boxwood took part in the General Assembly Legislation Day to raise awareness for the GCV and Conservation Network efforts to protect Virginia’s resources and supporting specific proposed bills. They met with delegates and senators representing their districts.

Endowment Fund Committee

The Boxwood Endowment fund was supported by donations for a sum of \$3,550 for 2023-24. The list will be published in the Green Book and on the website.

The Board requested \$2,100 from the Endowment Fund Committee to be distributed to the community organizations that align with the Boxwood mission. The amounts were presented to the Endowment Committee, the charitable arm of the club, and were approved for 2023-24 and paid in this fiscal year.

Two of the four Endowment members will remain for one more year, **Kathryn Angus**, President and **Nella Timmons**, Secretary/Treasurer, for a total of four years. Two members-at-large will be stepping down: **Robin Johnson** will be an Associate Member and **Tricia Branch** will resign for professional conflict-of-interest reasons. Two active members will be named to the Members-at-large positions for up to four years.

Exhibits Committee

Thank you to the Chairs, **Gina Denniston** (photography), **Lisa Caperton** (artistic) and **Jenny Andrews** (horticulture) for leading these committees. And to **Suart Roberts** for creating and supporting the spreadsheet to track these points.

The Silver Awards for Exhibiting based on Merit and Participation combines a year of cumulative exhibiting talent in photographic compositions/interpretation, floral design from informal to very detailed creations, and examples of the best horticultural stems grown by our members. The winners are often easy to guess based on the yearlong exhibiting and the practice that creates this expertise.
